

Guidelines for Members' Gallery

The WPA website has a Members' Gallery where you can exhibit up to 6 photos of your work along with some text about you and what you produce.

To make the website both more interesting and friendly we would like one of the photos to be of you at work, but recognise some people may not wish to appear personally. It is worthwhile deciding which of the six pictures will be used for the link to your gallery, also which picture goes in front your text. Normally we suggest your favourite picture for the link and 'you at work' beside the text. However, it's up to you if you want something different, or if you can't decide, we will choose appropriate images in consultation.

You should give a personal statement about your work using no more than 150 words. Most people use around 80 words or less. If you need help, take a look at other examples on the Members' Gallery pages. Don't forget to include any contact details you wish to be published. We can publish links to both your website and email address if required, at the moment we can only provide text entry for other platforms.

To display your creations in the members' gallery just follow the guidelines below and send us your jpeg photographs.

Try to position your subject roughly in the middle of the frame and leave some background space around the edges. It will look better and ensure nothing accidentally gets cut off.

Either take or crop the images square to fit the format of the gallery - otherwise we'll have to squeeze it to fit in and it will look distorted. If you are uncomfortable cropping images, then we'll happily do it for you if you send us the originals.

Once we have published your page we will notify you to check you are happy with it. If we are amending an existing page you should make sure you have cleared your browser cache, otherwise you may not see any changes. The means of doing this varies by browser but on Windows try pressing CTRL-F5 while on your gallery page.
